

Brass taper pin blanks for making old Irish harp tuning pins

Specification

These blanks are made in Northern Ireland to my specification. They are turned from solid brass.

The blanks are 105mm long, comprising:

square-section drive head, 6.4mm square, 25mm long #4 Imperial 1/48 tapered shaft, 80mm long

The blanks are turned on a lathe, so the surface is slightly ridged from the tool marks.

The blanks are intended to be re-worked to make finished pins:

- smooth tooling marks on tapered shaft
- cut short at one or both ends
- drill string hole approx 2 to 5mm from small end of shaft
- (optional) file down shoulders at junction of shaft and head
- file head down so flat faces are flush with shaft; reverse taper the square drive head
- file decorative grooves into faces and end of square drive head

Sizing

These blanks are intended as an equivalent of standard #4 harp pins. This photograph shows the relationship between one of my blanks, and a #4 x 3" blackened steel harp tuning pin.
